Vilnius 2nd meeting project

On September 11th and 12th the second meeting of the Icaro Project - Innovative qualifications for technological and organizational innovation in building sector, took place in Vilnius.

The project led by Formedil has as its partner: FLC Madrid, FLC Asturias, VSRC Vilnius, Alma Mater Studiorum UNIBO, Panevezys CCIC, Conseil des Architectes d'Europe, IIPLE Bologna.

The icaro project will identify a new qualification profile of the technician with new skills, in particular those related to the following areas: energy efficiency, digitization and transversal skills. During the meeting all the task and subtask leaders presented all the participant the work done since February, when the kick off meeting took place in Roma, till now.

Much attention has been focused to the WP4 on the quality, according to Equavet tool.



Project WP status quo

WP2 – analysis of the lack of existing skills and competences and identification of new needs, leader FLC Madrid – the following work tools has been produced:

- An European document on the education and training system in the participating countries

- An on line questionnaire at Construction companies in Italy, Spain, Lithuania . General report on the data results
- An European document which selects and highlights the main European legislative provisions which have an impact on technological innovation

WP3 – update and implementation of existing qualifications of worksite-head technician – leader Vilnius training center – proposal of an updating methodology and the creation of a new qualification path.

A semi-finished product was produced that highlights the training paths and the types of technicians existing in the participating countries.

Each tool and product is monitored and evaluated according to the forms prepared by the head of **WP4 FLC Oviedo**

Dissemination events



Rome 24 October 2019

In the context of dissemination, important activities of European projects, Formedil, organized in Rome on 24 October 2019 the event of dissemination of Icarus, benefiting from the second meeting of the Blueprint project, in which 12 countries and 24 organizations, including training centers, representatives of companies, and trade unions, participate. In this way Icaro was presented to the Blueprint partner countries and to the audience of the training building schools coordinated by Formedil.

In addition to Formedil, the event was attended by researchers, university professors / entrepreneurs, foreign training institutions outside the project such as the French CCCA, and the Flc of Madrid partner in the project. This people introduced on the one hand the innovative issues that are challenging the sector, including the Bim in the field of digitization, and on the other hand they represent some data on the technicians in Italy and in Europe and the provision of education and training dedicated to them.



Netherlands 22/23/24 October 2019

During the kick-off meeting and Symposium of the Drive0 project, which took place from 22 to 24 October at the Brightlands Chemelot Campus in Netherlands, the Ace which is also a partner of the Icaro project distributed the information material of Icaro.

DRIVE 0 is a EU-funded project, which aims to contribute to the decarbonization of the European building stock by developing a circular building renovation process. Partners from Estonia, Greece, Ireland, Italy, the Netherlands, Slovenia and Spain were present at the meeting
